
20% Le Cadeau (Chehalem Mountains AVA)

<u>Production Notes:</u> The 2015 Aubichon Reserve Pinot Noir was carefully selected after eleven months of aging from five barrels, each specifically chosen for their balance of ripeness and acidity after the warmer Oregon growing season. The result is a harmonious blend of three unique vineyards, ranging in elevation from 300-ft to nearly 800-ft, all with varying soil types and sun exposure. Our Reserve selection represents the finest Pinot Noir of Aubichon Cellars in 2015 and the meticulous craft of Jim Sanders.

<u>About the Winemaker:</u> Jim Sanders is the winemaker and a founding partner in Aubichon Cellars. Jim focuses on small production, hand-crafted wines, aged exclusively in top-tier French oak from the finest cooperages in Burgundy. Through two decades in the Willamette Valley, Jim's winemaking portfolio features some of Oregon's most acclaimed wines, including several cuvees of highly rated Pinot Noir from Le Cadeau Vineyard.
